Grant Recipient	Project / Program Description
AgeOptions	Empower older adults to access affordable health care by providing training and technical assistance to professionals who counsel this population.
Aging Care Connections	Support for the Aging Well Neighborhood, a community collaboration that connects older adults, businesses, healthcare providers, local government, community groups and social services to promote life-long wellness and support aging at home.
Casa Central Social Services Corporation	Support for the Adult Wellness Center which provides participants with enriching activities that stimulate and strengthen their cognitive, emotional, and physical functioning.
Center for Disability and Elder Law	Support to help meet the most urgent needs of Cook County's low-income senior population for pro bono legal services.
